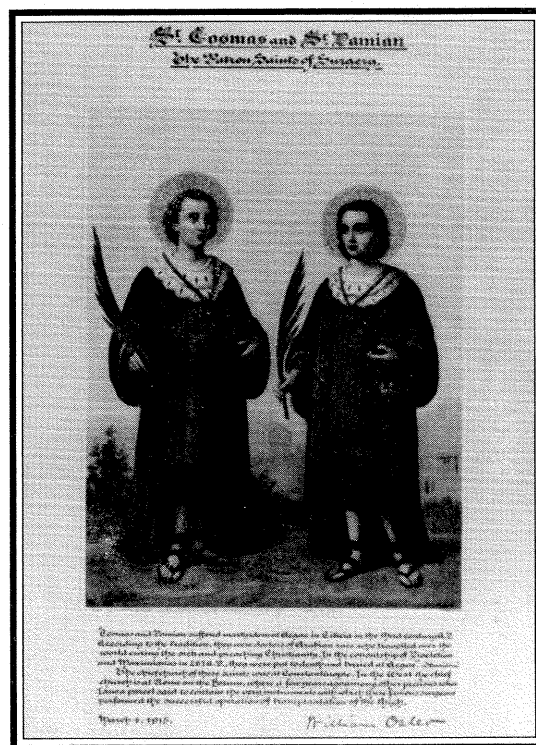

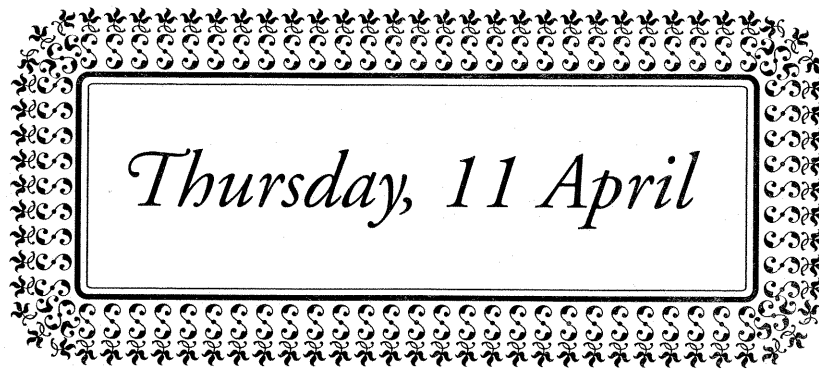

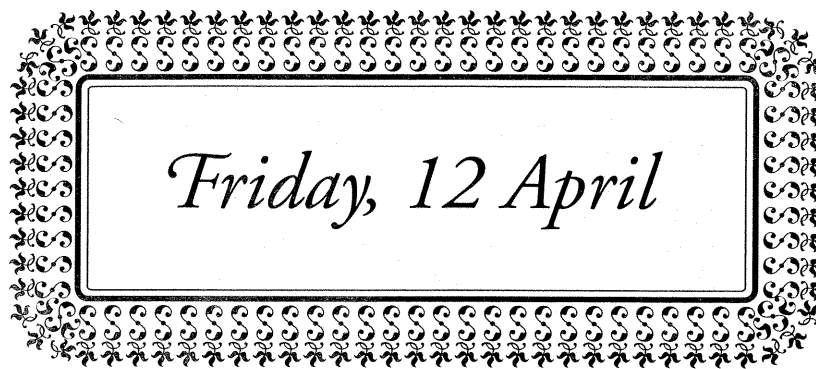

*T*HE AMERICAN OSLER SOCIETY has been founded for the purpose of bringing together members of the medical and allied professions who are, by their common inspiration, dedicated to memorialize and perpetuate the just and charitable life, the intellectual resourcefulness and the ethical example of William Osler (1849-1919). This, for the benefit of succeeding generations, that their motives be ever more sound, that their vision be on ever-broadening horizons, and that they sail not as Sir Thomas Browne's Ark, without oars and without rudder and sails and therefore, without direction.
