A brief description of some of the movies and books available on the issue of human trafficking.

DVDs

A Dance for Bethany (PG-13) 104 minutes

Reporter Abbey Fisher finds herself entrenched in crime and politics as she tries to befriend and help rescue Bethany, an exotic dancer who was forced into the business at the age of 12.

Bought and Sold (Unrated Documentary) 42 minutes

A documentary that goes undercover to meet with traffickers and victims of trafficking across the globe to investigate the intercontinental nature of modern slavery.

Dreams Die Hard (Unrated Documentary) 36 minutes

This Free the Slaves production looks into the stories of Maria, Christy, Miguel, and Rose and how they were trafficked from Mexico to the U.S. under false promises of a better life.

Dying to Live (Unrated Documentary) 33 minutes

This film takes an investigative, faith-based, look at the stories of migrant workers from Mexico. It interviews church leaders and theologians, activities, and the migrants themselves to explore the search for dignity and a better life through migration.

Fields of Mudan (Unrated Fiction) 103 minutes

This 2006 Academy Award finalist weaves the tale of Mudan, a young Asian girl sold to a brothel. There she befriends Faye and together they dream of a life safe in America.

Freedom Beyond (Unrated Documentary) 24 minutes

Another Free the Slaves production, this documentary follows the story of Rambho and other Indian children forced to work weaving carpets and what local activists are doing to combat this form of labor trafficking.

The Gatekeeper (Unrated Fiction) 103 minutes

Adam Fields is a border patrol agent who goes undercover to investigate a group of migrant border crossers. His world changes when he and the group are forced into drug trafficking. Winner of Best Film of the International Hispanic film festival.

Human Trafficking (Unrated Fiction) 180 minutes

This double Golden Globe nominee depicts the story of four girls from across the globe as they are forced into the sex trade. Mira Sorvino stars as an agent of Immigration and Customs Enforcement working to save one girl and bring her traffickers to justice.

Lives for Sale (Unrated Documentary) 58 minutes

This film looks into the story of two undocumented immigrants who were trafficked in Florida and California. It explores why a chance at the American dream is worth risking everything, sometimes even freedom.

Look Beneath the Surface (Training Video)

This DVD provides the basic information necessary to begin training others about the issue of human trafficking. Created by the Rescue and Restore Coalition of the Dept of Health and Human Services. The DVD contains videos in both English and Spanish.

Saving Maria (Short Unrated student film)

A realistic fiction of a young girl in Toledo.

Rescuing Emanuel (Unrated Documentary) 70 minutes

A film crew creating a film about poverty stumbles across Emmanuel, a street child in Nairobi. Emmanuel touches the crew and when he turns up missing they make it their mission to rescue him and work together to help him begin to fulfill his dreams.

Slavery 101 (Unrated Documentary) 12 minutes

This short film by Free the Slaves introduces the viewer to modern slavery around the world.

Stolen Childhood (Unrated Documentary) 85 minutes

Narrated by Meryl Streep, this documentary takes a look at child labor in 8 countries and the connection between poverty and globalization.

Taken (PG-13, strong violence) 93 minutes

Liam Neison stars as Bryan Mills, a former secret agent who finds himself entrenched in a battle to win back his daughter after she is kidnapped by European traffickers.

The Silent Revolution (Unrated Documentary) 18 minutes

This Free the Slaves DVD chronicles the story of a village of debt bound stone breakers and their rebellion against their traffickers. After winning their freedom we see a village begin to rebuild.

Trade (R) 119 minutes

This drama follows a young boy on his cross continent search to save his sister from sex traffickers bent on selling her to the highest bidder. With the help of Texas cop haunted by the ghosts of his passed they will fight to stop the auction before its too late.

A Crime so Monstrous By E. Benjamin Skinner (350 pages)

An undercover look at one mans journey to discover what goes on beneath the surface.

Be the Change by Zack Hunter (158 pages)

A book about one young teens faith based journey to stop human trafficking.

Disposable People by Kevin Bales (264 pages)

A look at modern day slavery in Thailand, Mauritania, Brazil, Pakistan, and India. (2000)

Ending Slavery by Kevin Bales (236 pages)

Another book by the leading force against modern day slavery. In this book Bales explores concrete methods on how to end slavery on a cultural and political level. (2007)

Enslaved edited by Jesse Sage and Liora Kasten with forward by Gloria Steinem (214 pages)

An anthology of 8 stories from survivors of trafficking.

From congress to the Brothel by Linda Smith (100 pages)

A look at child sex trafficking in the red light districts of Mumbai, India, and the Netherlands, Australia, ect.

Given Kachepa by Q.L. Pearce (37 pages)

A short story on labor trafficking meant to introduce the issue of contemporary slavery to a young audience. Tells the story of Given Kachepa, a boy for Zambia who auditioned for a traveling boys choir and found himself held captive in Texas.

Invisible No Mas by Jose Amin Cortes (Spanish)

Modern Slavery by Kevin Bales, Zoe Trodd, Alex Kent Williamson (250 pages)

A sociological look into modern day slavery and how demographics affect subcultures.

Nobodies by John Bowe (278 pages)

An in depth look at consumerism and forced labor within U.S. Borders.

Not for Sale by David Blastone (293 pages)

A great introductory book to the issue of human trafficking. Focuses mostly on over seas (non U.S.) trafficking with narratives from survivors and abolitionists alike.

The Sacred Bath by Theresa Flores (144 pages)

The first book written by the most unlikely of former victims, a girl from a well to do family in the suburbs of Detroit Michigan.

Sex Trafficking; The Global Market in Women and Children by Katherine Farr (262 pages)

A sociological look into the world of the sex trade. Considers culture, economics, and politics.

The Slave Across the Street by Theresa Flores (155 pages)

The second book written by Theresa Flores, again telling her story of victimization, but now with a stronger hand for story telling. In this book Ms.Flores incorporates her background as a social worker and discusses the overall issue of human trafficking and what we can do to support survivors and stop it from happening again.

Slavery Today by Kevin Bales and Becky Cornell (117 pages)

A comprehensive look at both historical and contemporary slavery Bales and Cornell (2008) take a global look at human trafficking and how products made by slaves enter each of our homes. It also outlines concrete steps on how to stop the tragedy.

Terrify No More by Gary A. haugen and Greg Hunter (245 pages)

Tells the story of undercover investigation spear headed by former UN war crimes investigator Gary Haugen and their fight to take down a sex trafficking ring in Phnom Penh.

Understanding Global Slavery by Kevin Bales (174 pages)

A socio-political look at slavery, where it comes from, why it persists, and how to stop it. (2005)
