Our communities face complex issues. We need leaders who can work sectors to address issues and find solutions.

Collaborative Leadership Fellows (CLF) is a unique, community-based leadership development program focused on a specific collaborative skill set, multi-sector networking, and learning applied to complex community issues. Our goal is to increase collaborative leadership capacity and have leaders ready to step into key roles within our community.

Participants explore the Six Practices of Collaborative Leaders through four 3-day skill building sessions. Topics include, but are not limited, to the following:

- Identifying personal strengths
- Building social capital
- Understanding power and influence
- Coaching and mentoring
- Resolving conflict within collaborations



In addition, participants have opportunities to apply their learning through cultivating multi-sector networks, developing and implementing a personal leadership plan, and actively participating in a Community Engagement Initiative where they apply collaboration leadership and process to an identified community issue.



History

CLF was founded in 2007 by the Family Action Collaborative (FACES) in Olmsted Country. The program was designed for the Olmsted County community by key stakeholders from local government, higher education, non-profit community, and the United Way of Olmsted County.
