WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION: This session will provide an overview of using program evaluation to understand the impact of your programs as well as to report on progress toward meeting your objectives for grant funders and other audiences. We will provide tips and tools, such as logic models and evaluation plans, that can streamline evaluation, reporting, and data-based decision-making for your organization. This session is intended for professionals for whom evaluation is not a primary role but who are required to have a good understanding of evaluation concepts and to perform some evaluation-related activities as a part of project responsibilities.

Presenters: Nicole MartinRogers, Senior Research Manager for Wilder Research, designs and consults on program evaluations and population-based survey research projects, specializing in culturally-based methods as well as study with and for very diverse populations.
