Other Zumbro Valley Mental Health Center Programs and Services

Chemical Health Services

- *Connections and Referral Unit* – secure, 24-hour detoxification program
- *Recovery programs* –outpatient treatment designed to help adults overcome their dependence on chemicals

Children's Programs

- *Children's Mental Health Resource Center* – series of support services to families of children with severe emotional disturbances
- *Root River Day Treatment* – offers mental health treatment to middle- and high-school students in a school-based setting

Community Support Programs

- *Case management services* – assist people with serious and persistent mental illness to function independently in the community
- *Day programs* – educational programs for adults with a severe mental illness that help participants learn basic activities of daily living

Housing

- *Housing options* – offers housing subsidies and assistance to locate safe, affordable housing to adults with a mental illness
- *Homeless services* – permanent housing program that provides case management and supportive services to single adults who are long-term homeless or chronic long-term homeless

Intensive Residential Treatment Services

- *Residential and crisis stabilization* – on-site program that provides mental health services for up to 12 adults
- *Crisis stabilization* – on-site program available for up to four adults requiring immediate support with their behavioral health symptoms

Outpatient Therapy Services

- *Psychiatric and psychological services* – therapy available to adults and children in individual and group settings to help participants heal emotionally and regain normal functioning

Working Together to Build an Independent Lifestyle

Are you ready to take more control over your recovery? your independence? your life?

Access to convenient, skilled resources can help those with a serious and persistent mental illness develop lifestyle goals and learn the skills necessary to accomplish day-to-day activities.

The Intensive Community Rehabilitation Services (ICRS) program provides a range of integrated services – psychiatry, case management, independent living skills, medication education and others – to help you build your own support network and develop the self-confidence to achieve your personal goals. Your team of experienced professionals will work *with* you to create a treatment plan based upon your needs. *Together* we can build the foundation for an independent lifestyle.

Intensive Community Rehabilitation Services is a collaboration of Zumbro Valley Mental Health Center and Olmsted and Fillmore counties.

YOU CAN ACHIEVE YOUR GOALS

By participating in the ICRS program, you become part of a team. Members of your team include:

Psychiatry – mental health assessments and evaluations; follow-up care; symptom management; education; and medication management.

Case Management – assessment and coordination of care; information about and access to community resources; access to medical, social, educational and other services; monitoring and follow-up support.

Adult Rehabilitation Mental Health Services (ARMHS) – goals focus on mental illness management; relapse prevention; healthy lifestyles; interpersonal communication; community resource utilization and integration; budgeting and financial management; household management; nutrition and cooking; employment-related skills; transportation training; shopping skills; and illness management.

Education about Medications – mental illness symptoms; role and effects of medications in treating symptoms; and side effects of medications.

Other Services – connection to medical and dental care; social and leisure skill development; and community services.

INDEPENDENCE BEGINS WITH THE FIRST STEP

Referrals are accepted from hospitals, clinics, community providers and the social service departments of Olmsted and Fillmore counties. Self-referrals and referrals from family members also can be received.

Eligibility criteria include:

- 18 years of age or older
- Diagnosis of a serious and persistent mental illness
- Resident of Olmsted or Fillmore county
- Services deemed medically necessary
- Participant's willingness to work with a multi-disciplinary team

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
