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Grant to Improve Transportation Options for Zumbro Valley Health Center Clients

Rochester, Minn. – The Operation Round Up® Trust Board recently awarded \$1,200 to Zumbro Valley Health Center to help access to treatment. The funding is being used to provide bus and taxi passes for clients without suitable transportation options.

"Numerous clients lack reliable transportation to get to and from their appointments," said Chief Executive Officer Dave Cook, LICSW, MSW. "This leads to missed appointments and delayed medication use which results in poorer management of their illness and worse outcomes. Many of these individuals have multiple chronic conditions, making it especially important they have regular appointments to visit their providers."

Cook added transportation has been a barrier to treatment for hundreds of Zumbro Valley Health Center clients.
